



NASA Mid-Atlantic welcomes you as a Time Trial Entrant at the North Course of Virginia International Raceway on July 28, 29!

GATE HOURS: Gates will open at 5:30PM on Thursday and will remain open all weekend. If you do not plan to arrive until Saturday morning for the weekend activities, please arrive by 7:00AM since there may be congestion at the gate. Please allow for plenty of time since you must attend the 7:30 AM ALL HANDS MEETING at the TECH SHED.

VIR CAMPING COSTS: \$35 to camp without electricity. \$25 for Electric only. \$50 if you are camping and need electricity.

GATE FEES: Gates will open at 5:30pm on Thursday 7/26 and will remain open all weekend. No trailer drops or gate entry will be permitted prior to 5:30pm Thursday. New for this year VIR will charge \$10 at the gate. Anyone arriving after 8:30am Friday may show their NASA membership card to gain free access. If you have crew arriving after 8:30am, they should list you as the driver and indicate they are a part of your crew. The gate staff will have a list of all pre-registered entrants. Camping for the weekend will cost \$35 without electricity, \$25 for electric only, or \$50 if you are camping and need electricity.

WRISTBANDS: You must wear your gate and your participant wristband all weekend. To receive your participant wristband which allows you on track, you must come to the registration tables at tech anytime during registration hours.

TECH: You must bring your car through tech to receive your tech sticker for the weekend. Be sure to have a completed tech form.

TECHISTRATION HOURS (tech shed):

Thursday evening: 6:30-9:00PM

Friday morning: 6:30-9:30AM

Friday 6:00PM until 9:00PM

Saturday 6:30AM until 9:30AM

Sunday 7AM until 9:30AM

MANDATORY MEETINGS: There is a mandatory All Hands Meeting near the tech area for all participants and workers at 7:30 AM Saturday morning and 7:45AM Sunday morning. All Time Trial entrants will meet immediately after those meetings with Jon Felton. Meeting place to be announced during the all hands meeting.

TRACK TIME: Time Trialers first session on Sat and Sun is with HPDE 4 and TT entrants must adhere to those passing rules which are: Passing anywhere with a required point bye. For timed TT sessions, there is open passing.

CAR NUMBER: Your car number is your first preference unless notified. You are responsible for having numbers on both sides of your car before coming to tech. Please see CCRs at nasaproracing.com if you have any questions.
